Dr. Tony Reiman

Dr. Reiman is a practicing medical oncologist at the Saint John Regional Hospital (SJRH), providing diagnosis, systemic therapy, outpatient and inpatient care to patients with cancer. In addition to his position with the Horizon Health Network, Dr. Reiman is a Research-Professor at UNB Saint John, Research Scientist at the Atlantic Cancer Research Institute, Assistant Dean of Research at Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick, and one of the first two recipients of a Canadian Cancer Society Research Chair.


Dr. Reiman's research program revolves around patient-oriented cancer research, including pre-clinical and clinical trials of novel therapeutics, cancer biomarker studies, and multi-disciplinary studies of supportive care interventions for cancer patients. He is particularly interested in multiple myeloma, lymphoma and lung cancer. The laboratory component of Dr. Reiman's research program is housed in the new DIMRI space, on the UNB Saint John campus. Dr. Reiman has attracted over \$1 million in research. He has also trained and mentored over 15 graduate students, published 2 books, 66 scientific papers, 1 patent, and 78 presentations at national and international conferences.

Dr. Reiman was raised in Saint John and is a graduate of the University of New Brunswick, the University of Toronto, Dalhousie University, and the Harvard School of Public Health.

His post-graduate residency training and research fellowship were conducted at Dalhousie University and the University of Alberta. Prior to returning to Saint John Dr. Reiman was a medical oncologist, Assistant Professor and Alberta Heritage Foundation for Medical Research Clinical Investigator at the Cross Cancer Institute and the University of Alberta.


The establishment of Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick (2010) and the Canadian Cancer Society Research Chair for New Brunswick (2011) allowed our health research and medical community to bring him back home. He will be also a Scientific Advisor for the upcoming Strategy for Patient Oriented Research (SPOR), a research support unit centered at UNB, in collaboration with other stakeholders, funded by NSERC and CIHR.

He is a trained clinical trials investigator and chair or is a member of several National Cancer Institute of Canada Clinical Trials Groups. Since returning to New Brunswick, Dr. Reiman has already obtained several distinctions and research grants from national agencies and health charities.
